### Wildlife Management

- There is still time!
- Activity based
- Need to be able to show you have been active
- Not meant to be more difficult or costly than Ag
- Appraisers job is a little more difficult – no animals to look at
- You can make it easier by doing what's expected and keeping good records







### General requirements & expectations

- 3 of 7 practices at the very minimum more is always better
- Proof of meeting required intensity acreage, number, frequency
- Activity was done in the year for which it is being requested
  - Annual report
- Show that you have been active in your management you or someone (Plateau, tenant, other)
- This proves that you deserve the 1-D-1 valuation it is important

#### Do it or get help to ensure it gets done.





## Why it's important to keep good records

- You're going to be asked for them at some point
- Your property tax valuation can depend on it
- It can be hard to catch up, in both compliance and management goals my memory is not what it once was
- Reassurance of knowing if you're on the right track
- It can be all the Appraisal District (CAD) ever sees paint a picture
- More and more CADs are requesting annual reports of activities





## What the CAD expects & how they inspect

- Annual reports
- Site inspection
- Plan updates





### Tools of the trade

- Wildlife Management Plan tells me how to do all of this and lets the CAD know what I'm doing
- **Camera** most important
- GPS good, but not a must
- Maps always helpful
- Log book for notes
- Calendar more notes
- Folder receipts, reports, etc.



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




### Maps

Maps are great tools to help identify what has been done and where

Create a new map at the end of each year when there have been changes or a major project completed



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### **Good records**

- Before and after photos
- Calendar record showing when any work was done
- Receipts if someone else performed work
- Map showing acreage treated
- Description of what was done and how it benefited your wildlife and fit your plan
- Product installation GPS / mapping
- Photos of wildlife using products (supplemental water, food or shelter)

#### Anything that will help prove what you have done this year.



### Minimum requirements: must completely 3 of 7 activities

- 1. Habitat control
- 2. Erosion control
- 3. Predator control
- 4. Supplemental food
- 5. Supplemental water
- 6. Supplemental shelter
- 7. Census









### Habitat control

Game population management – deer harvest, photo records Brush management – now is a good time to get this done Riparian management – always a good time to protect sensitive areas



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### **Erosion control**

#### Pond/tank construction Streamside, pond, wetland re-vegetation Dam construction/repair

Check on previously completed projects or start new ones Take photos and document the work and how it is progressing \*\*10 Wildlife Management year activity\*\*





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
### **Predator control**

Feral animals (hogs, cats, etc.) – any time, but more pleasant now Imported Red Fire Ant control – before it's too cool, after rains Native predators (skunks, raccoons)



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### **Supplemental food**

Grazing management – don't let them eat it all Strip discing – something new will grow where you let it Feeders & mineral supplementation – check feeders & record activity





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### **Supplemental Water**

Wildlife rain collectors Wells, troughs, windmill overflow Spring development/enhancement





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### **Supplemental shelter**

Nest boxes, bat boxes – clean now, again early next year Brush piles & slash retention – winter birds love brush piles Pasture management (strip mowing)



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### Census

Spotlight counts, incidental observations, wildlife camera surveys Songbird count – Winter Bird Surveys Harvest data collection – while hunting, record what you harvest

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




### Winter & resident bird survey

**Now through February** – unique species & unique uses of your property

Inexpensive & very appropriate end of the year compliance activity we perform all across our services regions



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- Record keeping is important do it right to prevent further scrutiny
- It does not have to be burdensome, but it does have to get done
- If DIY treat as if someone is paying you to do it
- You will get asked at some point, be prepared
- Good annual reports and plan updates when changes are made or every five years can prevent misunderstandings
- Plateau can help and does for hundreds of landowners across Texas if you don't want to have anything to worry about this is a sure bet



### What if I'm not ready

- Work on log sheets and calendar entries to help create a story of what was done throughout the year
- Check nest boxes
- Complete a winter bird survey
- Complete a camera survey
- Check and fill feeders and water sources + gather photos
- Contact Plateau, ask questions and get help where needed
- Annual reports, site visits to gather documentation
- Consider a service agreement with Plateau




