# **Understanding the MLD Program**

- MLDP is a volunteer program through Texas Parks & Wildlife (TPWD)
- Intended to support proper stewardship on private lands in Texas
- Wildlife and habitat management, not specifically deer management
- Allows extended hunting season lengths and more harvest opportunities




#### Former MLDP System

- Levels I, II and III, each with different requirements and season lengths
- Required hands-on approach with landowner, agent & TPWD biologist
- TWIMS (Texas Wildlife Information Management Services)
- Very popular and growing steadily

#### Why is change needed?

- Huge growth in MLDP participation since 1998
- TPWD capacity challenged to keep up with high demand
- Program in need of streamlining and stabilization
- Deer numbers still high need for liberalized harvest in some ecoregions

#### **MLDP Changes**

- Changes adopted by TPWD Commission in August 2015
- Old programs consolidated
  - MLDP Levels I-III
  - Mule Deer MLDP
  - LAMPS
- TWIMS changed to Land Management Assistance (LMA) website
- New MLD Program two "options"
  - Harvest option
  - Conservation option



# **Harvest Option**



#### **Harvest Option**

- Automated option "do-it-yourself"
  - Provides deer harvest recommendations
  - General deer tag issuance, based on property size and ecoregion
  - General guidance on habitat management
  - White-tailed deer ONLY
- Does NOT require:
  - Wildlife management plan or habitat management practices
  - Deer surveys / deer population data
  - Interaction with TPWD biologist
- Enrollment deadline September 1<sup>st</sup>



#### **Harvest Option**

- 2017 Season Dates
  - Antlerless
    - September 30, 2017 February 28, 2018
  - Bucks
    - September 30, 2017 November 3, 2017
      - Bucks with at least one unbranched antler may be taken with any lawful means, including modern firearms
      - Any other buck lawful archery equipment
    - November 4, 2017 February 28, 2018
      - Any buck may be taken through any legal means

- Site-specific option
  - More attractive option to landowners seeking customizable recommendations and harvests
  - More advanced technical guidance and assistance from TPWD
  - Number of tags issued are based on deer surveys / population data
  - Comparable to Level III MLDP
  - Allows for Mule Deer harvest
- Enrollment deadline of June 15<sup>th</sup>

- Entry Requirements
  - TPWD-approved Wildlife Management Plan (WMP)
  - Two preceding years:
    - Deer population data
    - Harvest data
    - At least two habitat management activities
- Continued Participation Requirements
  - Current year deer population data
  - Harvest report
  - Three annual habitat management practices
    - Supplemental Food no longer considered habitat management activity
  - TPWD site inspection



- Wildlife Management Associations (WMAs)
  - Single WMP
  - Tags issued to each individual property
  - All members must report (April 1 deadline)
- Aggregate Properties (contiguous / low fence only)
  - Single WMP
  - Must meet MLDP requirements as a whole
  - Single point of contact must be designated for aggregate acreage

- 2017 Season Dates
  - White-tailed Deer
    - September 30, 2017 February 28, 2018
  - Mule Deer
    - September 30, 2017 November 3, 2017
      - Antlerless and buck lawful archery equipment only
    - November 4, 2017 February 28, 2018
      - Antlerless and buck by any legal means


- Enrollment / Account Creation
  - Required by each applicant
  - Must be completed through online system LMA
  - Email address required for landowner and designated agents
  - Requires property boundary

- Tag Information
  - Required to print your own tags
  - Hunter must keep tag in legible condition
  - MLDP tags only valid for specific tract of land for which they are issued and type of deer
  - Hunting license tags cannot be used on deer for which MLDP tags are issued

- Harvest Logs
  - Logs must be maintained and reported
  - Hunters required to enter harvest in log on same day of kill
  - Harvest log must be maintained until last day of tag validity
- Reporting
  - Number of bucks and antierless deer harvested (both HO and CO)
  - Habitat management practices implemented (CO only)
  - April 1<sup>st</sup> deadline
  - Must be completed in LMA online system
    - Failure to report will result in removal of MLDP



- Aggregate Properties
  - Multiple landowners may combine contiguous low-fenced tracts of lands to create an aggregate acreage for MLDP enrollment
  - Available for both Harvest or Conservation Options
  - Tags may be used on any or all tracts of land in the aggregate



Expected roll out of the new LMA system on July 1, 2017





#### How can Plateau help?

- Designated Agent
  - Coordination with landowner, ranch manager, TPWD biologist
- Technical Assistance and Implementation
  - On-site habitat assessments and consultation
  - Preparation of Wildlife Management Plans
  - Conduct deer sampling
    - Traditional spotlight survey
    - Remote camera survey
    - Incidental observations
  - Assist with submittal of harvest data
